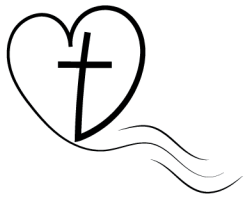


Love Offerings

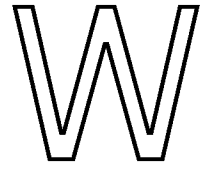

Leader: Michael and Gabrielle Santiago



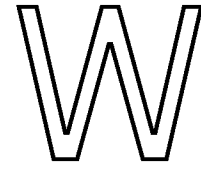

WORKSHOPS 2: If God is sovereign over all things, do my choices even matter?



Leader: Liyang Ng

Explore one of the most pressing—and often confusing—questions Christians face: How do God's purposes and our personal decisions fit together? Drawing from Scripture and pastoral experience, Liyang will guide participants through a tension many feel but few understand. The session invites those who have wrestled with questions about God's will, life direction, or spiritual uncertainty to discover a biblically grounded path that brings both clarity and peace. Rather than offering formulas or shortcuts, Liyang opens a conversation that helps believers see how God's sovereignty and their everyday choices belong beautifully together.

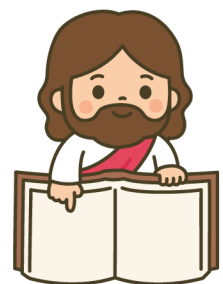
